Hawstead Annual Plant Fair and Tea & Coffee Morning Saturday 25th May 9am -12.30pm At Hawstead Village Hall

Hawstead's Annual Plant Fair will take place on Saturday 25th May from 9am to 12.30pm at the Village Hall. There will be a stall selling tea, coffee, cake and breakfast bacon rolls if you'd like to come down and meet up with neighbours and browse what's for sale. With the price of plants and potting compost rocketing, the opportunity to buy affordable plants grown by local villagers or split from plants that grow successfully in Hawstead gardens is a fantastic way to increase your range of garden plants while raising money to support subsidised village activities including the Triple 20's Christmas Lunch and the Christmas drinks party, both free to villagers.

Myself and villager Lesley Carey have been growing seedlings and splitting plants for months to get ready for the plant fair. We've already got an amazing selection of plants ready, from bedding to perennials, vegetables to houseplants. We need more though. So if you are growing any seeds and can spare a few for the plant fair, or can split plants in your garden to donate to the plant fair, we would be extremely grateful. We have run out of greenhouse space, so we are asking for villagers to volunteer to take a tray of seedlings to look after them on their windowsill or in a greenhouse (until the last chance of frost is over) until the plant fair.

This year you can now buy or pre-order plants ahead of the plant fair and either collect them immediately or on 25th May. Hawstead Play Area

Hawstead Community Council is very aware of the winter flooding and generally poor state of the play area bark surface. We are currently consulting with drainage and play area experts so that the right solution is found and implemented as soon as possible. We could simply dig out and replace the bark, but we need to see whether anything else can be done cost effectively to prolong the use of the play area throughout winter. Watch this space!

To save the village money, we will need lots of physical help some time in the next few months to replace the bark surface. So please step forward when we call for help.

A jam-packed summer planned for the Great War Huts

'We have been working on our programme of events for 2024 at Great War Huts, and have some brilliant speakers, some great subjects, and some wonderful events planned. Our monthly Hutted Histories talks start again at 7pm on Wednesday 24th April, when Caroline Drew will be talking about aspects of life during the First World War air raids by Zeppelins and Gotha bombers and tells the stories of some of the civilians who lost their lives. The rest of the season of Hutted Histories talks will be on the **fourth Wednesday each month** and cover a wide range of topics, including The Suffolk Regiment on D-Day by our own Taff Gillingham in **May**. We also have a number of major events planned:

- A celebration of the famous trench newspaper, The Wipers Times, in conjunction with Norwich Printing Museum, on **Saturday 1st June**.
- We are incredibly lucky to welcome German-British historian and writer, Katja Hoyer, to give her talk, Blood & Iron: The Rise and Fall of the German Empire, 1871-1918, on **Saturday 7th July**.
- On **Saturday 27th July**, by popular demand, we are repeating our Lee Enfield rifle talk, covering the history of the rifle and the opportunity for everyone to handle them.
- The Salonika Campaign will be the feature of a day of talks on **Saturday 31st August.** Many people who live in East Anglia have relatives who took part in this part of The Great War, which is rarely mentioned. The Salonika Campaign Society will be joining us to put that right.
- Our monthly talks and tours about the project are already booking up and we have added a number of family tours this year, which are more child friendly.
- In August, during the school summer holiday, we will be holding our popular 'Training for Trenches' for 7- to 12-year-olds.

Are you interested in becoming a member?


